

NHS Grampian Tobacco Policy Consultation Questionnaire

All replies will be treated as confidential.

The revised NHS Grampian Tobacco Policy will introduce a smoke-free environment on all NHS Grampian sites. This will mean that **no one will be permitted to smoke on any NHS Grampian premises or grounds**. This extends the current ban, which applies to enclosed and substantially enclosed spaces only. Please give us your views.

1. What are the best ways to let patients, visitors and staff know that they are not allowed to smoke anywhere on NHS Grampian premises and grounds?

As far as I understand there is no basis for this extension of the smoking ban in law. The Trust has no powers that it can enforce on the general public.

Whether it can enforce rules on patients or staff is another matter. However bringing in a smoking ban that applies throughout the staff's time on the hospital grounds cannot be said to be a mutually agreed change to conditions of service.

The inhumanity of making the sick leave the premise if they wish to smoke speaks for itself. (In addition, there are issues of cross contamination to be addressed if patients are leaving the grounds.)

NHS-administered NRT is the only 'help' available to patients whom the Grampian NHS Trust wishes to deny choice. The nicotine market is 'rigged' in favour of NHS nicotine treatments. For that reason I would not use it on principle. I believe the one-year success rate for nicotine replacement therapy averages about 10 per cent, and I would also not wish to waste my time on it for that reason, nor health service money.

6. Any other comments

This kind of proposal completely undermines our confidence in the trust. It is a trust that puts appearances above care for patients, visitors and staff. Insisting on staff carrying 'approved' NRT rather than tobacco when coming into work is disrespectful to staff. Insisting on people leaving the grounds before smoking leaves potential unresolved staffing issues, and risks making a stressful occupation even more stressful./
